

KITTEN SEASON IS HERE!

They're furry and cute and they need our help. So far in 2022, the WAHS has cared over 147 kittens. Neonate and young kittens are some of the most vulnerable pets in need in shelters as they require around the clock care for first few weeks of their lives. Because of this, our team at the WAHS depends on fosters to help us provide the lifesaving care these tiny pets need. The WAHS hosted two kitten bottle baby classes this year where participants learned how to care for the smallest of kittens. We also provide fosters with everything they could possibly need!

MEDICAL ADVANCEMENTS

Big things are happening at the WAHS! On June 13th, an X-ray machine was installed at the WAHS. This machine was fully funded through four different grants totalling \$50,000. Instead of transporting animals to local vets or hospitals, our medical team will now be able to take X-rays onsite. This allows our vet team to get faster results and is less stressful for the animals involved. This diagnostic ability helps the WAHS give a better quality of care to all the homeless, neglected and abused animals that enter the shelter's doors. The WAHS is thankful to all the generous foundations that made this happen!
